- **Be specific**: give concrete examples; name names; don't think primarily about broad concepts (peace, human rights, theology, etc.), but more about concrete alternatives or steps forward in creating a just world. We particularly appreciate articles that point to issues being ignored or neglected by those in power, voices and perspectives that need to be heard or movements and/or initiatives that use analytical insight, moral courage, and strategic clarity in their struggle to create a just world. Provide **concrete advocacy aims, alternatives, and solutions** not just critiques.
- If possible, we would also like to include **photos** that you have taken that are relevant to the article. If you have any photos that could be presented in the newsletter, we invite you to submit digital copies in as high-resolution as possible.
- You are also invited to submit a **photo of yourself** to be included in the newsletter.
- If you are representing an organization, we invite you to send a **2-3 sentence** description of the organization that we can include in the newsletter.
